Held at Little Flower School in Maharajganj, the event brought together 594 attendees, including 350 persons with disabilities, 86 parents and guardians, government officials, dignitaries, and representatives from various institutions. The celebration was a testament to PGSS's unwavering commitment to promoting the inclusion, empowerment, and rights of persons with disabilities, allgning with this year's global theme: **"United in action to rescue and achieve the SDGs for, with and by persons with disabilities."**

Since 2005, PGSS has observed the International Day of Persons with Disabilities under the name **UDAAN**, symbolizing the soaring spirit and potential of persons with disabilities. Each year, the event serves as a platform to foster understanding, challenge stereotypes, and advocate for the dignity, rights, and well-being of persons with disabilities. This year's celebration, **UDAAN-XVII**, was no exception, as it showcased the remarkable talents and resilience of individuals with disabilities while sensitizing the community to their unique challenges and aspirations. One of the highlights of **UDAAN-XVII** was the spirited sports competitions, which included Cricket, Football, Badminton, Kho-Kho, Long Jump, Shot-put, and a thrilling Tricycle Race. These events not only showcased the physical prowess and determination of the participants but also fostered a sense of camaraderie and inclusive sportsmanship. The competitions were a powerful reminder that disability is not a barrier to excellence. The event left an indelible mark on all attendees. For persons with disabilities, it was a day of validation and empowerment, as their abilities took center stage. Parents and guardians expressed gratitude for the sensitization efforts, which helped them better understand and support their loved ones. Government officials present at the event pledged to address the concerns raised by persons with disabilities and their families, ensuring better access to resources and opportunities. Economic Empowerment



Purvanchal Gramin Seva Samiti (PGSS), is revolutionizing rural livelihoods by distributing 1,500 female goats to 750 beneficiaries, the initiative ensures each household receives two goats, green fodder seeds, and a goat shed, creating a strong foundation for sustainable income generation.

Designed around an innovative revolving model, the program ensures scalability and long-term impact. Offspring from the distributed goats are passed on to new beneficiaries in subsequent phases, creating a cycle of growth and empowerment. Beyond distribution, the program integrates marketing initiatives and awareness campaigns, equipping beneficiaries with essential knowledge in goat rearing and sustainable farming practices.


The impact of the livelihood initiative extends far beyond immediate livelihood support. It fosters community participation, knowledge sharing, and economic resilience, particularly empowering women to achieve self-reliance. By combining resource distribution with skill development, the program lays the groundwork for sustained economic growth and improved quality of life in rural areas.

PGSS remains steadfast in its commitment to driving change through innovative, community-driven initiatives. The initiative stands as a testament to the power of collaboration, innovation, and perseverance in building a brighter, more sustainable future for rural communities.





Child Rights & Anti Human Trafficking



In 2023, Purvanchal Gramin Seva Samiti (PGSS) spearheaded transformative initiatives across border areas of Uttar Pradesh to protect children's rights, combat exploitation, and enhance access to education. The organization's holistic approach focused on reducing vulnerabilities to child labor, trafficking, and abuse while strengthening systems for rehabilitation and educational equity. Through grassroots mobilization, policy advocacy, and community engagement, PGSS has created safer environments and brighter futures for thousands of children.

PGSS achieved significant progress in safeguarding children from exploitation, addressing 193 rescue cases and registering 25 legal interventions. Targeted efforts curbed child labor (53 cases), prevented child marriages (7 cases), and responded to child sexual abuse (16 cases). The organization also tackled substance abuse (10 cases), school dropouts (44 cases), and missing children (6 cases), ensuring timely support and protection. By raising awareness and empowering communities, PGSS reduced risks and fostered environments where children can thrive free from harm.

The program made strides in combating child trafficking, intercepting 8 trafficking cases and providing emotional support and guidance to 24 survivors. PGSS expanded rehabilitation services, partnering with law enforcement to establish 1 Child-Friendly Police Corner, ensuring sensitive handling of cases. These efforts not only rescued children from exploitation but also paved the way for their safe reintegration into society, restoring dignity and hope.

PGSS prioritized education as a cornerstone of child empowerment, establishing 25 Education Help Centers to offer remedial classes and reduce dropout rates. These centers supported marginalized children, particularly from disadvantaged groups, improving school completion rates and academic outcomes. By addressing barriers to education, PGSS enabled children to envision and pursue brighter futures. PGSS strengthened grassroots governance by forming 7 Village Child Welfare Committees, 3 Block-Level Committees, and 25 Child Parliaments to amplify children's voices in decision-making. Additionally, 25 Child Clubs, 25 Youth Groups, and 25 Mahila Mandals were mobilized to advocate for child rights at the community level. Localized support systems, including 3 Child Help Desks and 25 Adolescent Girls' Groups (AGG), ensured holistic protection and empowerment, fostering a culture of collective responsibility.

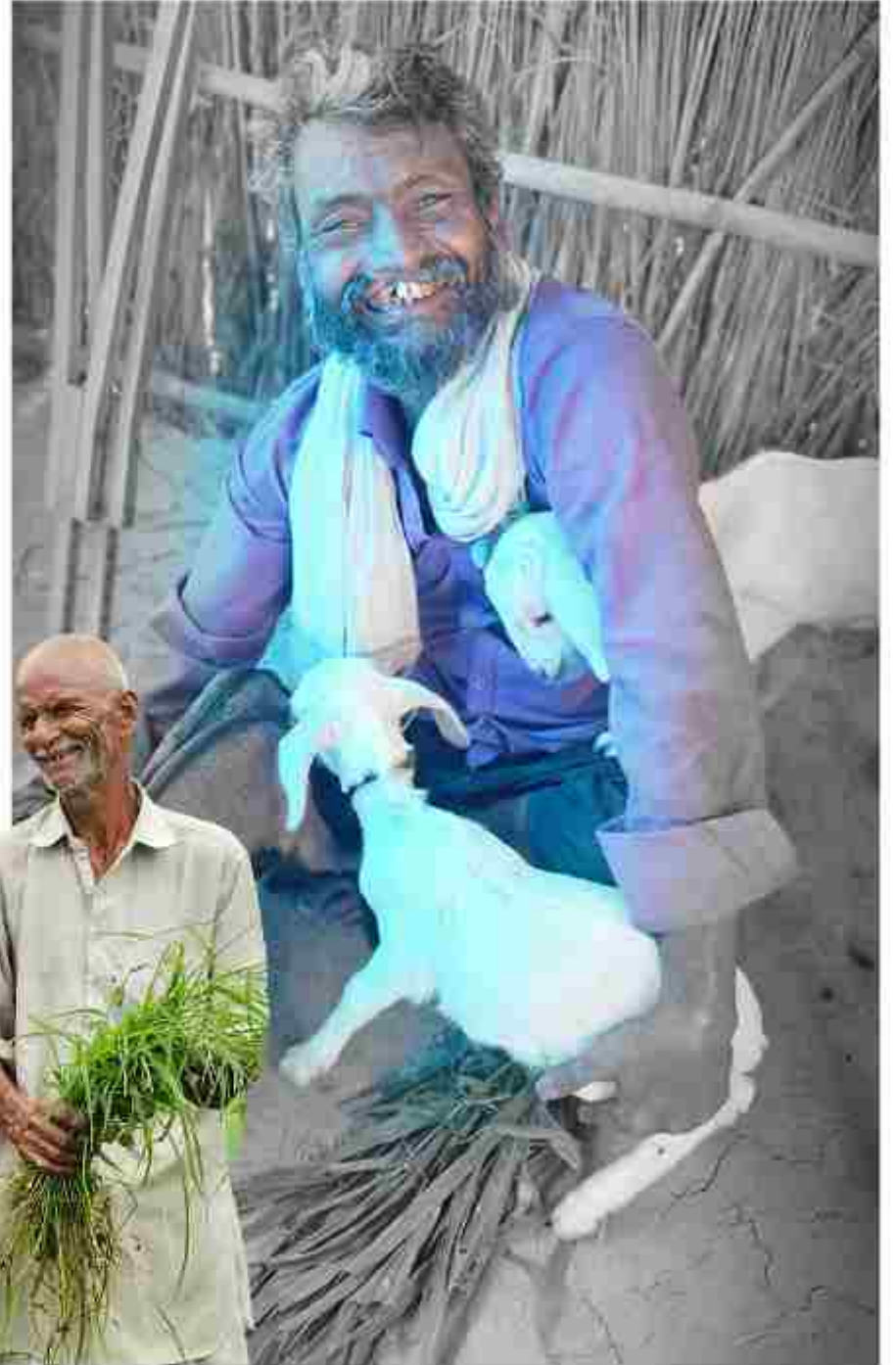

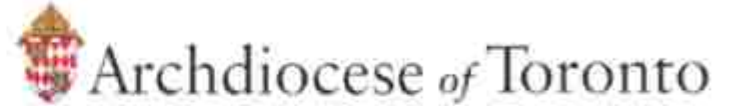
