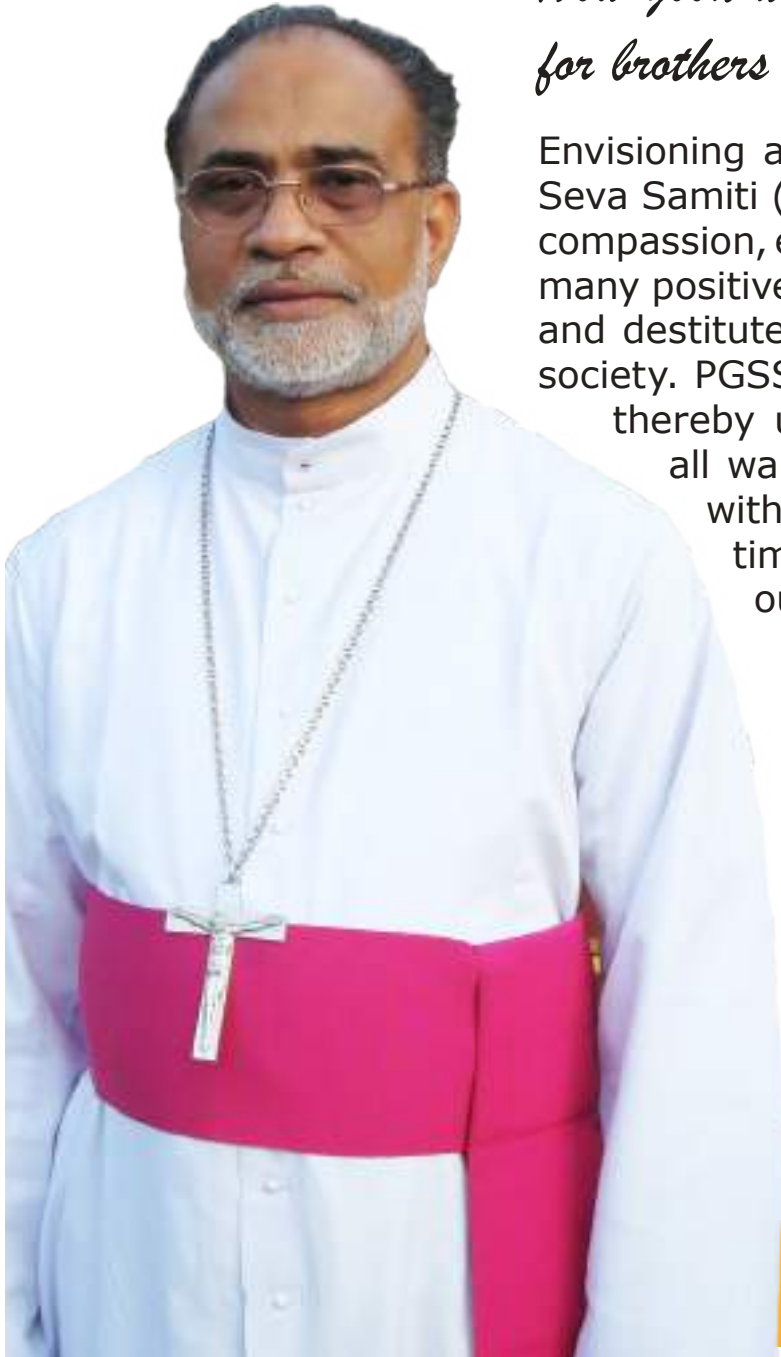

Understanding the pivotal role of health in community development, the Purvanchal Gramin Seva Samiti (PGSS) has been at the forefront of health promotion throughout the year 2022-23. Addressing the multifaceted aspects of health care, PGSS has implemented a comprehensive approach tailored to meet the specific needs of the community it serves.

Through 1047 Mobile Outpatient services (MOPDs), PGSS provided essential medical services to 6391 beneficiaries, ensuring that quality health care reached the doorsteps of those in need. This mobile solution bridged the gap between remote areas and healthcare facilities, highlighting PGSS's innovation in community health services delivery. Pathology labs play a vital role in disease diagnosis and management. Recognizing this fact, PGSS facilitated access for 118 beneficiaries to pathology lab services, which is critical for early detection and treatment of various health conditions.

PGSS also understood that awareness is just as crucial as medical treatment in the sphere of health. Therefore, we conducted 279 awareness sessions covering 11760 participants. These sessions covered vital health topics, promoting preventive measures and overall wellbeing among community members.

Realizing the value of specialized medical attention, 9 specialized health camps were organized, benefiting a total of 1698 individuals. These camps provided targeted care and consultations by specialists, thus addressing complex health issues that require expert intervention.

In conjunction with offering direct health services, PGSS recognized the importance of clean environments for ensuring community health. Aligned with the Swachh Bharat Abhiyaan to conduct three events which drew the active participation of 697 individuals. This initiative not only underscored the significance of hygiene and sanitation in preventing diseases but also fostered a culture of health consciousness.

By working in solidarity with government health departments, PGSS has anchored a robust system of healthcare delivery that is responsive and responsible. PGSS's multifaceted approach to tackle health issues in the year 2022-23 reflects a comprehensive understanding of community health needs. By incorporating direct medical interventions, educational programs, specialized camps, and sanitation initiatives, creating healthier and more resilient society.

Community Health





Self-Help Groups (SHGs) and Inclusive Self-Help Groups (iSHGs) represent the bedrock of economic empowerment, embodying a community-driven model that not only fosters financial inclusion but also upholds the principles of inclusion and accessibility. The impact of these groups transcends mere numbers and statistics, echoing the resilience, determination, and potential of individuals, including those with disabilities, as they navigate the path towards economic self-sufficiency and prosperity.

One of the defining hallmarks of SHGs and iSHGs is their unwavering commitment to inclusion, with iSHGs specifically endeavoring to include persons with disabilities in their fold. The integration of persons with disabilities within these groups not only serves as a testament to their capabilities and contributions but also underscores the power of an inclusive and supportive community structure in fostering economic resilience and independence.

The easy access to financial services through SHGs and iSHGs is instrumental in providing a lifeline for small and marginal households, facilitating the enhancement of their income and livelihood. By leveraging loans and savings within the community, members can initiate additional income generation activities, thereby setting in motion a cycle of economic growth and financial stability.

The impact of SHGs and iSHGs is illustrated through compelling statistics: 1163 SHGs with a membership of 16162, including 1900 members with disabilities. The total savings of SHGs stand at an impressive 87,465,920 units, with total loans amounting to 75,873,698 units. This financial leverage has emboldened 9164 members to take loans, amplifying the reach and impact of economic empowerment. Moreover, the total interest accrued stands at 33,926,230 units, solidifying the sustainability of these community-driven financial mechanisms.

At the heart of SHGs and iSHGs lies a vibrant community-driven model that not only imparts financial benefits but also nurtures creating a sense of ownership and accountability. By pooling resources, SHGs and iSHGs foster a culture of interloaning, which does not merely facilitate access to capital but also cultivates an environment of support and collaboration, thus amplifying the economic potential of every member.

Economic Empowerment





Rise in inflation, has affected agriculture practices in India. Since most of the population lives below poverty, it is not wrong to term it as 'Poor Man's Tax'. Inflation is very sensitive towards the agricultural production, particularly the food grain production. Though agriculture is an essential part of the state/national economy, it has not received due attention of the policymakers, whatever schemes are available do not percolate to the end user. This leaves little or no choice for the farmers, but to purchase items like pesticide, seeds etc. from open market. Due to high prices of raw materials and low sales price (owing to chain of intermediary vendors), the 'Return on Investment (ROI)' is very less for the farmers, majority of times they end up incurring heavy losses.

Looking at the dismal condition and actualities PGSS pledged to improve the condition of the farmers and give them a self-sustainable model of agricultural practices. Through intensive surveys and meetings, PGSS derived two major causes for the farmer grievances:

- High Input Cost: Immediate focus was required to curb the cause and reduce the input cost for higher ROI.
- Low technical knowledge levels and awareness about government schemes: Secondary only to the high cost, low knowledge levels, and awareness is also adding to the gravity of the situation.

Natural Resource Management (NRM) came as the reply to all the concerns. PGSS introduced organic farming under NRM. Organic farming is a method of crop and livestock production that involves much more than choosing not to use pesticides, fertilizers, genetically modified organisms, antibiotics, and growth hormones; organic production is a holistic system designed to optimize the productivity and fitness of diverse communities within the Agro-ecosystem, including soil organisms, plants, livestock, and people. The principal goal of organic production is to develop enterprises that are sustainable and harmonious with the environment. The principal reason for the choice of organic farming was low input cost, eco friendly approach, and preservation of soil and water. Purvanchal Gramin Seva Samiti (PGSS) has been zealous supporter of organic farming, many activities are being done in order to promote organic farming and make it popular among the masses. 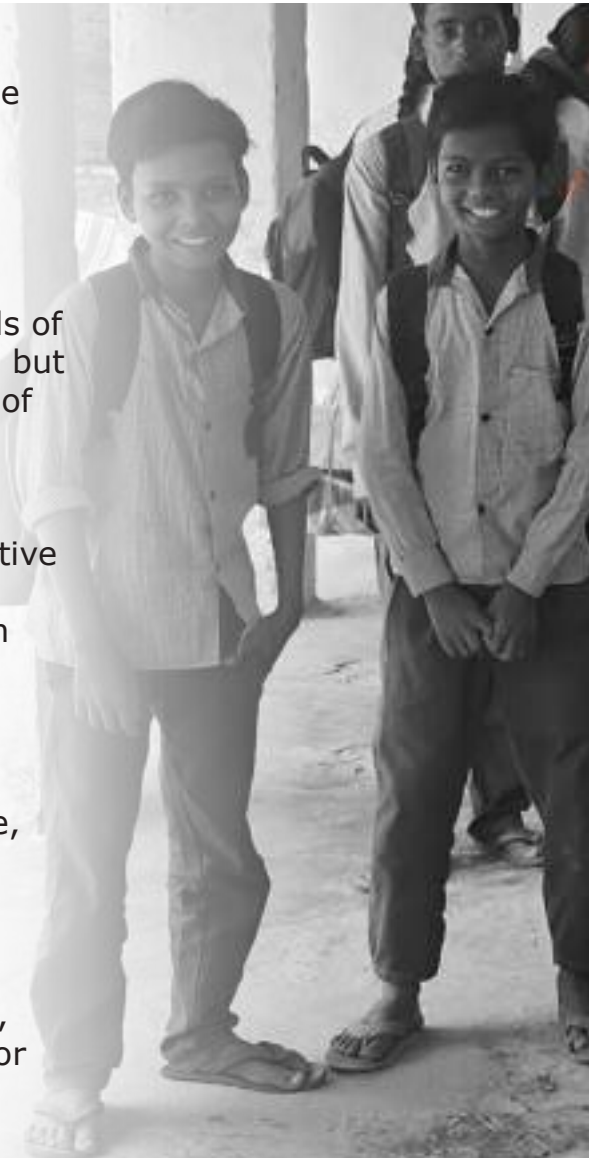

Inclusive Education



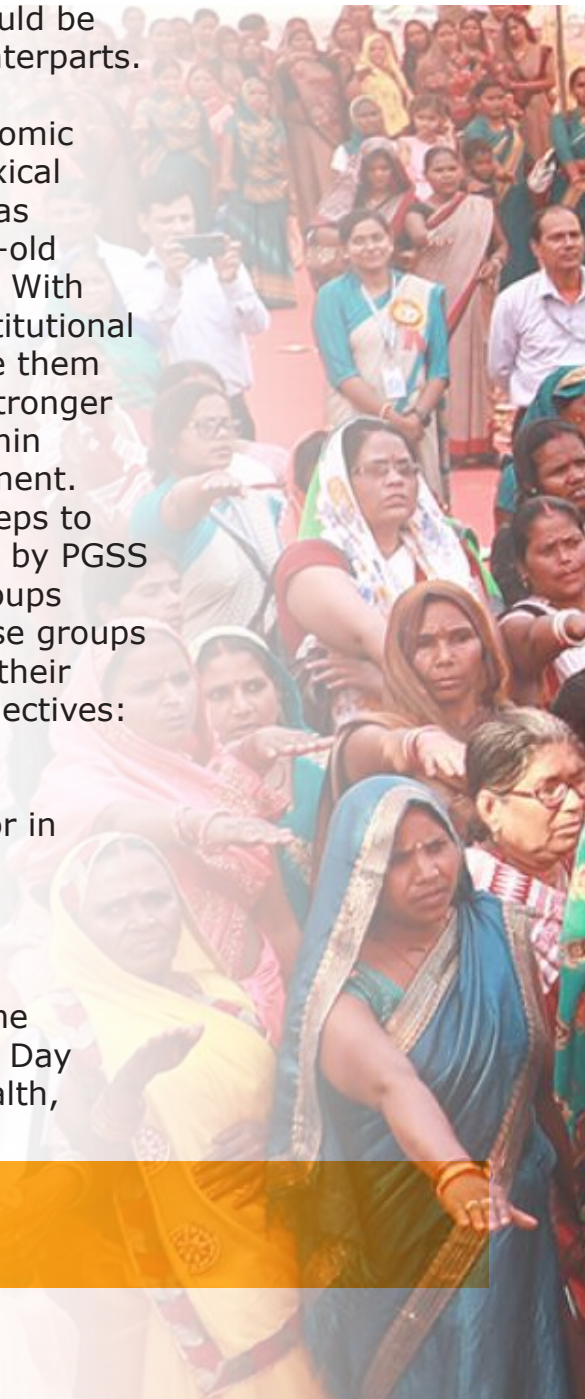

In alignment with the thought process and vision of the Organization, PGSS has taken several steps to fortify position of women in the society. 602 Mahila Mandals (Women's Group) have been formed by PGSS as a major resource of inspiration for women's welfare. Self-Help Groups are usually informal groups whose members have a common perception of need for and importance of collective action. These groups promote savings among members and use the pooled resources to meet the emergent needs of their members, including the consumption needs. Mahila Mandals (MMs) are formed with following objectives:

- To increase participation of women in all social activities.
- To involve all women members into important discussion making.
- To encourage women to take steps to identify and eradicate problems/issues in households or in entire village.
- To promote savings amongst the members of the group.
- To induce the feeling of mutual cooperation amongst the members.

To increase the social and economic status of women. Members of Mahilia Mandal celebrated some significant days International Women's Day, International Women's Health Day, Safe Motherhood Day etc. emphasizing on women health and vaccination, women empowerment, child and mother health, MGNREGA and other important issues.

Women Empowerment





In a world where the rights and welfare of children ought to be a primordial issue addressed with urgency and care, Purvanchal Gramin Seva Samiti (PGSS) stands out as a vanguard for change, hope, and protection. Child rights are not merely an ideal but represent a keystone in the foundation of a progressive society, and PGSS has been a relentless intercessor for these rights. In our commitment to safeguarding children, PGSS has been a beacon of hope, providing shelter to 444 children through its open shelter home. This haven serves as a sanctuary for children who have been on the fringes of society, offering not just a roof over their heads but also a nurturing environment that attempts to heal and foster growth.

A particularly poignant facet of PGSS's work is the restoration of children back to their homes. With 310 children successfully reunited with their families, the organization underscores the intrinsic value of a nurturing family environment while also being vigilant about the safety and well-being of these children post-restoration.

The rescue operations conducted by PGSS are a testament to its commitment to child rights, with 1727 children rescued from vulnerable and exploitative situations. These rescue efforts often mean the difference between a life lived in the shadows and one that is given a fresh start with the promise of a brighter future.

Child rights advocacy requires a multidimensional approach, and PGSS has embraced this philosophy wholeheartedly. At the core of its mission is the understanding that protection, education, health, and psychological well-being are intertwined facets that cannot be addressed in isolation.

Educational programs empower children with knowledge, a critical tool for breaking the cycle of poverty and ignorance. Health initiatives ensure that the physical well-being of children is safeguarded, allowing them to grow strong and resilient. Psychological support caters to the often overlooked emotional scars that many children bear, providing professional assistance to help them overcome these hurdles.

An integral part of PGSS's advocacy for child rights is being a voice for the voiceless. The organization not only provides immediate aid but also works tirelessly to influence policy, engage the community, and promote awareness—initiatives that are crucial for systemic change.

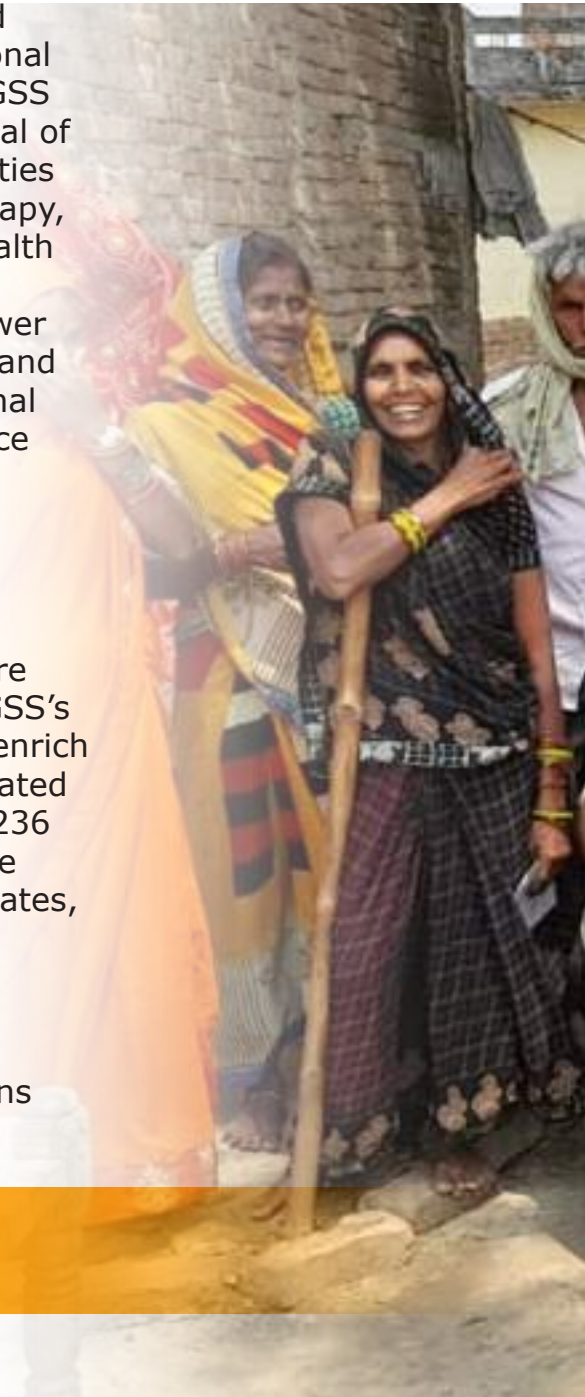

A cornerstone of PGSS's initiatives for persons with disabilities and children with disabilities is the provision of home-based physiotherapy and occupational therapy, benefiting 2636 and 636 individuals, respectively. These services not only address immediate health needs but also signify PGSS's dedication to ensuring that every person has the opportunity to achieve their highest level of functionality and independence. Recognizing the transformative power of education, PGSS has provided home-based special education for 219 children with disabilities and established a center-based special education program for a further 139 children. These educational interventions are instrumental in nurturing the potential of every child and instilling the confidence and skills necessary to navigate the world with resilience and determination.

PGSS's support for income generation initiatives has impacted the lives of 1271 persons with disabilities, fostering a sense of independence and self-sufficiency. By providing opportunities for economic empowerment, PGSS has fostered a culture of inclusion and contribution, reinforcing the inherent value and capabilities of every individual. The provision of assistive devices, exposure visits, and outings for 1132 persons with disabilities and children with disabilities underscores PGSS's commitment to ensuring that every individual has access to the resources and experiences that enrich their lives and expand their horizons. In addition to direct interventions, PGSS has actively facilitated linkages with government schemes, ensuring that 2164 individuals receive disability pensions, 1236 individuals are immunized, and 3654 individuals receive essential health check-ups. Beyond these vital initiatives, PGSS has ensured that individuals have access to Aadhar cards, disability certificates, assistive devices, and various government entitlements, empowering them to participate fully in society and access critical services.

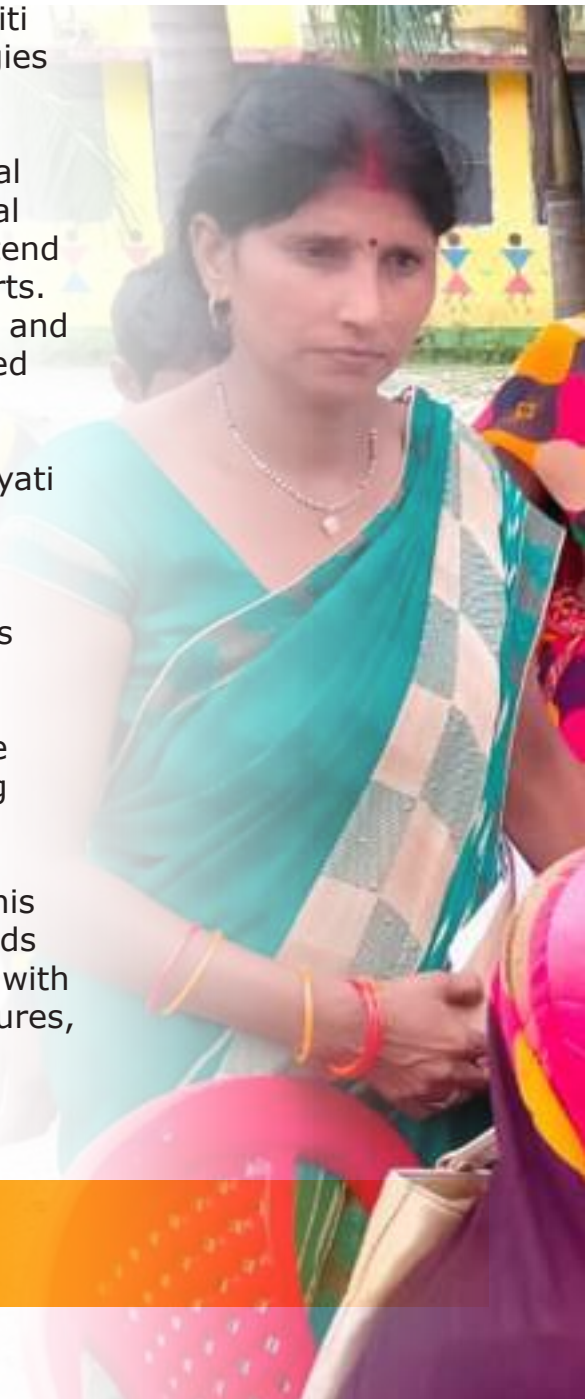

Fatima Hospital

Operational Overview:

Fatima Hospital at present provides Inpatient and Out patient services in Cardiology, Urology, Neurology and Nuerosurgery, Gasteroenterology, Dermatology, Nephrology, General Medicine, Resipiratory Medicine, General and Laparoscopic Surgery, Gynaecology, Ophthalmology, Paediatrics, ENT, Dental, Radiology & Imaging, Pharmacy, Pathology, NICU, PICU, MICU, SICU, Dialysis, Community health and department of Blood Transfusion etc. We had a total number of 85,093 outpatients and 6491 Inpatients under the reporting period.

Awards and Recognitions

- In 2023, Fatima Hospital achieved the prestigious NABH Full Level Accreditation, marking a historic milestone as the first General Hospital in Gorakhpur to attain this exceptional level of excellence. It has also received the NABL Entry Level Accreditation for its Laboratory after fulfilling all compliances of National Accreditation Board for Testing and Calibration Laboratories, Quality Council of India.
- Additionally, Fatima Hospital has been honored with the Cleanest Hospital Award by the Gorakhpur Municipality.
- Fatima has received the certificate of Membership of Vision 2020 – The right to Sigt – India.

Community Outreach and Public Health Initiatives:

Emphasizing our commitment to social responsibility, the community department at Fatima Hospital actively organized numerous health camps in villages. Over the reporting period, we conducted a total of 30 General Camps, 248 Eye Screening Camps, and 15 additional camps focused on various health aspects such as blood donation, dental care, and more. These initiatives aim to raise health awareness and identify individuals in need of further medical attention within the communities we serve.



New Developments

- We have Started new Male and Female General Ward adding up a capacity of 34 beds from 14 beds.
- In our ongoing efforts to deliver focused and high-quality care to Obstetrics and Gynecology (OB and Gyane) patients, we have established separate OB and Gyane Block. This specialized facility, located on the second floor of the hospital building, comprises a well-equipped ward, a state-of-the-art Labor Room, a specialized Labor Operation Theater (OT), and an Intensive Care Unit (ICU).
- To enhance our surgical capabilities and provide advanced care to our patients, we have recently inaugurated a new Operation Theatre Complex and Central Sterile Services Department (CSSD) Block.
- Establishment of a new Dialysis Department at the third floor of the Hospital building is an another milestone. The new department has a bed capacity of 14 beds and 14 dialysis machines. Gallant Ispatt, ICICI Foundation for Inclusive Growth and Joy Alukkas Foundation has helped us to actualize this department.
- In collaboration with CBM India, Fatima Hospital has achieved another milestone with the blessing and inauguration of our newly constructed Eye Hospital. The Eye Hospital is designed to function as a tertiary eye care center, delivering specialized services to address various eye diseases.
- The Hospital has procured one ACLS Ambulance with the support of LIC Golden Jubilee Foundation and one Ophthalmic Community Van with the support of ICICI Foundation for Inclusive Growth.



Ongoing Developments

The Hospital is actively engaged in several ongoing projects aimed at enhancing the quality of health services provided to our patients:

- Renovation of the Billing and Pharmacy Department
- Furnishing of the second and third floors of the Eye Hospital
- Shifting of the Old NICU
- Modification of a new Administrative Block
- Installation of Fire and Safety Devices

Plans Ahead

The Hospital is embarking on several significant projects to enhance its infrastructure and services such as New Staff Quarters, Installation of 500 kW Solar Panel, Outsourcing of CT & MRI, procurement of CSSD Equipments, Procurement of Adult and Paediatric Ventilators, Restructuring of Emergency, OPD and reception, Installation of a new lift etc.

Medical Education

Fatima Institute of Medical Sciences has commenced the BSc Nursing program with an intake of 40 students per batch. The program is approved by Atal Bihari Vajpayee Medical University, Lucknow.

The DMLT (Diploma in Medical Laboratory Technology) Course offered by the institute has received recognition from the Uttar Pradesh State Medical Faculty. This program was previously administered by NIOS, Allahabad.

Currently, the institute offers nursing courses including BSc, GNM, and ANM. Additionally, paramedical courses such as DMLT and DOPT are also available. At present, we have a strength of 473 students and 69 teaching and non-teaching faculties at our Institute.
